- Minor Injuries Units at Rossendale and Accrington
- The Urgent Care Centre in Burnley

Currently we fund a Health Access Walk-in Centre based at Accrington Victoria Community Hospital which aims to serve the whole of East Lancashire.  An alternative to the Health Access Centre (based in Accrington) is being considered. This alternative is to introduce Health Hubs in Hyndburn, Burnley, Pendle and Rossendale, with access to a hub for Ribblesdale patients, rather than us providing one centre for the whole of East Lancashire.  Each of these hubs would be contactable by phone and offer access to GP services by appointment from late afternoon to 8pm Monday to Friday. In addition, the hubs in Burnley and Hyndburn would offer 8am to 8pm appointments on Saturdays and Sundays for all East Lancashire residents. For Ribblesdale patients, this would be available on Saturday mornings.  The minor injuries unit and GP out-of-hours service which are both based at Accrington Victoria Community Hospital would not be affected.
